Report on the Fire Hydrant locations and maintenance schedules for the City of Ingleside.

BACKGROUND:

City Council requested a report on the location of fire hydrants within the City of Ingleside. Attached is a map identifying the locations of the City's 302 active fire hydrants. Fire hydrants are occasionally damaged by vehicle impacts. Depending on the extent of the damage, City staff determines whether the hydrant requires a complete replacement or if specific components need to be repaired or replaced. Hydrants may develop leaks over time that require repair or replacement. The maintenance that is required is performed on an as-needed basis by the City Water Department staff. The City staff is proactive in placing and/or replacing blue reflective hydrant markers on streets to assist in identifying hydrant locations at night or low visibility situations.

Every five years, the State Board of Insurance conducts fire hydrant flow tests to evaluate the City's fire protection rating. This rating is used to help determine property insurance rates. Fire hydrants are flow tested when a problem is suspected. Several fire hydrants are identified as dead-end main flushing sights to maintain the chlorine residual in our distribution system as required by TCEQ. These hydrants are flushed on a monthly basis.

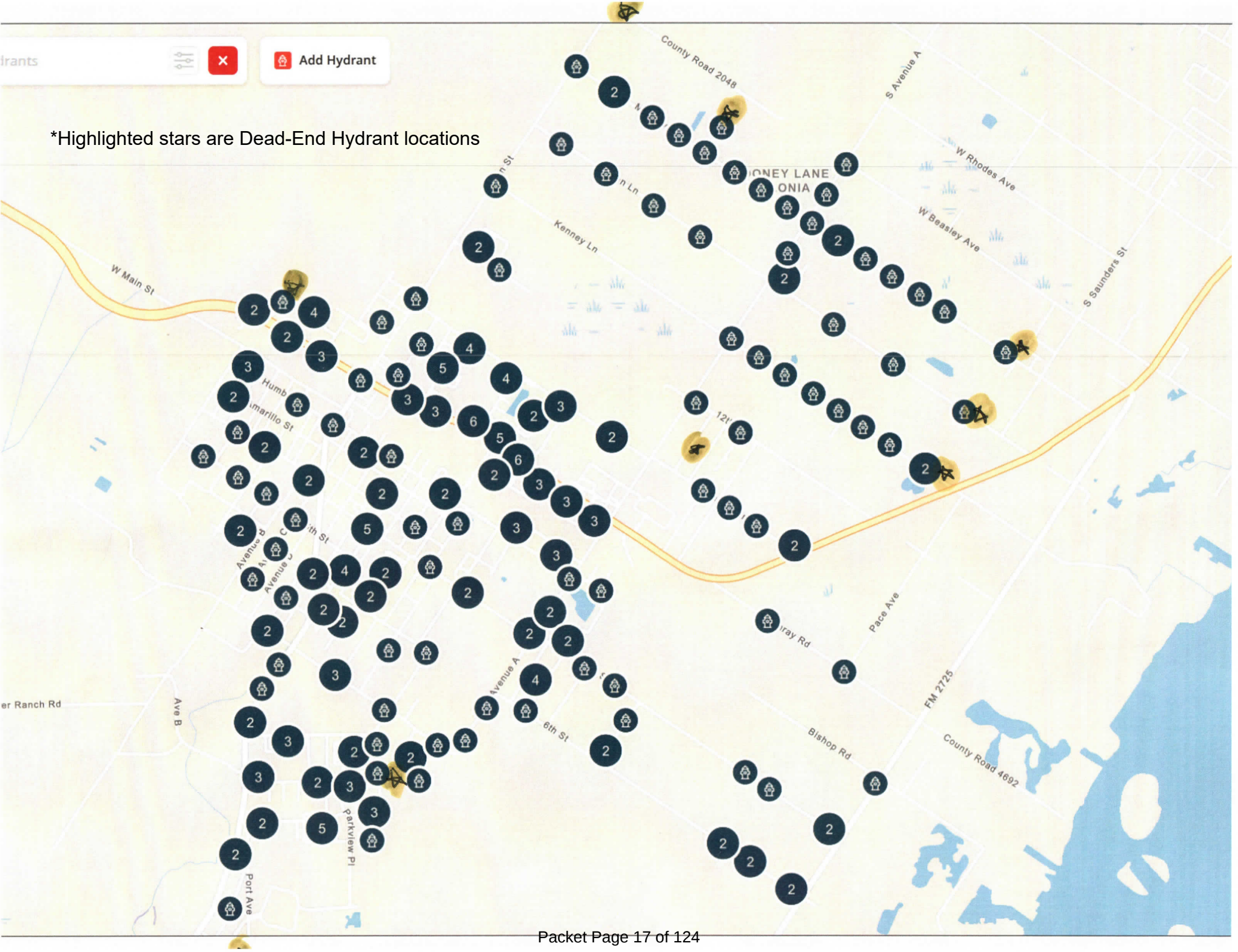
1. FIRE HYDRANT MAP

A report on providing affordable swim classes at the Charles H. Doherty Municipal pool.

BACKGROUND:

At a recent City Council meeting, a citizen inquired about the possibility of the City of Ingleside Parks and Recreation Department providing swim lessons for the citizens. City Council requested City staff to evaluate the possibility of providing this service to the citizens at Charles H. Doherty Municipal pool. There are currently swim lessons being offered locally in the cities of Corpus Christi, Aransas Pass, Portland and Rockport. Some of these pools provide classes year round in heated and indoor pools, which prove to be a very competitive situation. There are certifications, supplies, insurance, and staffing issues that would need to be addressed. This demonstrates the importance of multiple certified personnel on a full-time basis. In order to provide this service, the City would need to either contract with a certified provider or have an employee complete the required certification training. Swim Instructor classes utilizing the American Red Cross "Learn to Swim Program" are \$320 for four days. Classes must have a minimum of 6 students, which comes to a total cost of \$1,920.00 and is valid for 2 years.

City Staff recommends not starting a program at this time. Further discussions with Phillips 66 will take place and City staff will report back to City Council at a future date.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

The cost of providing this service for the residents could be \$50-\$60 per person. There is an opportunity to obtain a grant from Phillips 66 to cover the swim class enlistment fee, the instructor, lifeguards, and other materials required for the class to operate. The grant board accepts applications in January and decides on awards in March of every year. Staff is in contact with Phillips 66 representatives about the possibility of them providing a grant for these services.

In the last 18 months, the Coastal Bend Region has experienced drought restrictions at a Stage 3 level. The drought has caused the various entities to research and pursue alternative potable water sources to become more drought resistant with the least financial impact on potable water customers. The City of Ingleside and the City of Aransas Pass representatives have been working together to establish a framework to evaluate and discuss a future potable water supply agreement. To further pursue this endeavor, a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is needed. The City of Aransas Pass acted affirmatively on the MOU at their last City Council Meeting, and the MOU was placed on this agenda for Council consideration.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
REGARDING THE EVALUATION AND POTENTIAL DEVELOPMENT OF
A FUTURE POTABLE WATER SUPPLY ARRANGEMENT**

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is entered into by and between the **City of Ingleside**, Texas, a home-rule municipality organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas (“Ingleside”), and the **City of Aransas Pass**, Texas, a home-rule municipality organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas (“Aransas Pass”), each referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Ingleside is pursuing the development of an additional potable water supply source, currently contemplated through a proposed water supply project (the “Proposed Water Supply Project”), to meet its current and future municipal water needs;

WHEREAS, if successfully completed, the Proposed Water Supply Project is anticipated to provide Ingleside with an additional source of potable water that may be available to support a future potable water supply arrangement with Aransas Pass, subject to Ingleside first meeting the current and anticipated needs of its own utility customers;;

WHEREAS, Aransas Pass has expressed an interest in obtaining potable water from Ingleside should additional potable water become available through the Proposed Water Supply Project;

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that any future wholesale water supply or other potable water supply arrangement with Aransas Pass will require additional engineering, financial, operational, regulatory, and legal evaluation, and may require the construction of transmission facilities and the negotiation of mutually acceptable contractual terms;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to establish a framework for exchanging information and negotiating in good faith regarding a potential future wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement to facilitate the provision of potable water to Aransas Pass while recognizing that any such agreement remains subject to further evaluation and approval; and

WHEREAS, the Parties acknowledge that Ingleside must first ensure that any future water supply adequately serves the current and anticipated needs of its own utility customers before committing water for wholesale delivery.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

1.1 Purpose. The purpose of this MOU is to establish a framework for cooperation and good-faith negotiations regarding potential development of a future potable water supply arrangement between Ingleside and Aransas Pass if additional potable water becomes available through Ingleside’s Proposed Water Supply Project.

1.2 No Commitment. This MOU is intended solely to facilitate future discussions and planning. Except as expressly provided herein, nothing contained in this MOU shall obligate either Party to enter into a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement to facilitate the provision of potable water to Aransas Pass.

ARTICLE 2

2.1 Conditions Precedent. The Parties acknowledge that any future wholesale water supply agreement shall be contingent upon, among other things:

- a) Ingleside successfully securing an additional potable water supply through the Proposed Water Supply Project;
- b) Ingleside determining, in its sole discretion, that sufficient potable water is available to satisfy the current and anticipated needs of its own utility customers while making water available for wholesale sale;
- c) Aransas Pass determining that it has the legal and contractual authority to purchase potable water from Ingleside, including identifying and, where appropriate, addressing any existing contractual obligations, regulatory requirements, or other legal restrictions that may affect such purchase;
- d) completion of any engineering, operational, and feasibility evaluations necessary to determine the viability of delivering potable water to Aransas Pass;
- e) identification of mutually acceptable delivery infrastructure and allocation of responsibility for the design, permitting, construction, ownership, operation, and maintenance of such infrastructure;
- f) receipt of all governmental, regulatory, and third-party approvals, permits, consents, or authorizations required to implement the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement;
- g) agreement upon mutually acceptable commercial, operational, and legal terms;
- h) approval of the wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement by the governing bodies of both municipalities; and
- i) the Parties determining that the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement is in their respective best interests.

ARTICLE 3

3.1 Negotiations. Following the Parties' evaluation of the matters identified in Article 2, and if the Parties determine that the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement is feasible and in their respective best interests, the Parties intend to negotiate in good faith the terms and conditions of a mutually acceptable wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement to facilitate the provision of potable water to Aransas Pass.

ARTICLE 4

4.1 Exchange of Information and Evaluation. The Parties agree to cooperate in exchanging reasonably requested engineering, operational, financial, legal, contractual, regulatory, and planning information necessary to evaluate the feasibility of the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement. Such cooperation may include evaluating existing water supply agreements, contractual obligations, available water supplies, projected water demands, regulatory

requirements, infrastructure needs, financing considerations, and any approvals, waivers, amendments, consents, or other actions that may be necessary to facilitate a potential wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement.

Nothing in this Article shall require either Party to disclose information that is confidential, proprietary, privileged, or exempt from disclosure under applicable law.

ARTICLE 5

5.1 No Commitment. Nothing contained in this MOU shall:

- a) reserve, dedicate, or allocate any quantity of water to Aransas Pass;
- b) grant Aransas Pass any priority right to purchase water;
- c) obligate Ingleside to construct facilities;
- d) obligate Ingleside to reserve capacity for Aransas Pass;
- e) obligate Ingleside to sell water; or
- f) obligate Aransas Pass to purchase water.

The Parties acknowledge that any commitment regarding the sale or purchase of water shall be set forth only in a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement approved by the governing bodies of both Parties. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as requiring Ingleside to dedicate, reserve, or make available water that Ingleside determines is necessary to meet the current or anticipated needs of its own utility customers.

5.2 Existing Water Supply Obligations. The Parties acknowledge that Aransas Pass' ability to purchase wholesale potable water from Ingleside and Ingleside's ability to supply potable water to Aransas Pass may be subject to existing contractual obligations, regulatory requirements, bond covenants, permits, or other legal restrictions, including existing agreements governing the purchase or supply of water. Each Party agrees to evaluate whether any such obligations or restrictions would affect its ability to enter into a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement with the other Party and, if appropriate, to pursue any approvals, consents, waivers, amendments, or other actions reasonably necessary to facilitate the Parties' consideration of a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement.

5.3 No Representation. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as a representation or warranty by either Party that it presently possesses all legal, contractual, or regulatory authority necessary to enter into or perform a future agreement or other potable water supply arrangement contemplated by this MOU. Nothing herein shall require either Party to breach any existing contractual or legal obligation.

ARTICLE 6

6.1 Term. This MOU shall remain in effect for three (3) years following the Effective Date unless earlier terminated in accordance with this Article. The Parties may extend this MOU by mutual written agreement approved by the governing bodies of both Parties.

6.2 Termination. Either Party may terminate this MOU upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other Party. This MOU shall also automatically terminate, without further action by either

Party, if Ingleside determines that the Proposed Water Supply Project will not proceed or is otherwise abandoned.

ARTICLE 7

7.1 Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this MOU and made a part hereof for all purposes.

7.2 Cooperation. The Parties agree to cooperate in good faith throughout the evaluation of the proposed project.

7.3 Municipal Authority. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to limit or impair either Party's authority to exercise its governmental, legislative, regulatory, or proprietary powers or to make decisions regarding the operation, management, or expansion of its municipal water utility system in accordance with applicable law.

7.4 Governing Body Approval. Any agreement shall remain subject to further negotiations, approval by the governing body of each municipality, and execution by duly authorized representatives.

7.5 Non-Binding. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, this MOU is intended solely to establish a framework for evaluating and discussing a potential wholesale water supply arrangement between the Parties and does not create any binding obligation to enter into a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement.

7.6 No Obligation to Proceed. Each Party reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to discontinue discussions or negotiations regarding the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement at any time. No Party shall have any liability to the other arising from its determination not to proceed with the proposed wholesale water supply arrangement or from the Parties' inability to negotiate or reach agreement on the terms and conditions of a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement.

7.7 Costs. Each Party shall bear its own costs and expenses incurred in connection with this MOU and the negotiation of any agreement.

7.8 Assignment. Neither Party may assign this MOU without the prior written consent of the other Party.

7.9 Governmental Immunity. Nothing in this MOU is intended to, nor shall it be construed to, waive or limit either Party's governmental immunity, sovereign immunity, official immunity, statutory limitations on liability, or any other rights, remedies, defenses, or protections available under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

7.10 Governing Law and Venue. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The Parties agree that exclusive venue for any action arising out of or relating to this MOU shall be in the state courts of competent jurisdiction located in San Patricio County, Texas.

7.11 Entire Agreement. This MOU constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous negotiations, discussions, understandings, and communications, whether oral or written, relating to such subject matter.

7.12 Amendments. This MOU may be amended only by written instrument approved by the governing bodies of both Parties and executed by their duly authorized representatives.

7.13 Counterparts; Electronic Signatures. This MOU may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which together shall constitute one instrument. Electronic signatures shall be deemed original signatures.

7.14 No Reliance. Each Party acknowledges that it is entering into this MOU solely for the purpose of facilitating discussions regarding a potential wholesale water supply arrangement. Neither Party shall be entitled to rely upon this MOU as creating any right to receive or purchase water or as guaranteeing that a wholesale water supply agreement or other potable water supply arrangement will be negotiated or executed.

7.15 Notices. Any notice, request, demand, consent, approval, or other communication required or permitted under this MOU shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when delivered personally, when sent by nationally recognized overnight courier, when deposited in the United States mail by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or when transmitted by electronic mail, provided that no notice of failed transmission is received. Notices shall be sent to the following representatives, or to such other representative or address as a Party may designate by written notice:

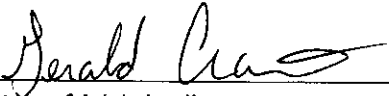

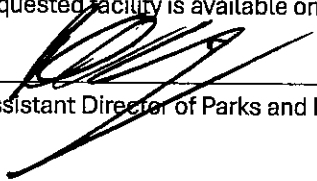

**FACILITY USAGE AGREEMENT
THE CITY OF INGLESIDE AND TEXAS COAST YOUTH SOCCER LEAGUE**

This agreement made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2026 by and between Texas Coast Youth Soccer League, (hereinafter referred to as “Texas Coast”) and the City of Ingleside, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as “City”) for the use of City owned soccer fields, located at N.O. Simmons Park in Ingleside, Texas (hereinafter referred to as “Facilities” or “Facility”). The Texas Coast and the City for the considerations stated herein mutually agree as follows:

A. Scope of Services

- (a) Texas Coast agrees to provide and operate a recreational youth soccer program within the City of Ingleside.
- (b) The city agrees to allocate city owned soccer fields to meet the Texas Coast’s soccer program’s needs for 2026 Fall Season and the 2027 Spring Season (as specified in section B of this agreement) and other considerations as stated below.

B. Term of Agreement

The term of this agreement shall be from August 31, 2026, through December 06, 2026, and from January 4, 2027, through May 9, 2027. At this agreement’s expiration, the Texas Coast will vacate the Facilities entirely, including removing personal property and trash.

C. Use of Facilities

Texas Coast shall have exclusive use of the Facilities during dates shown above, except where otherwise stated in this agreement. Texas Coast will not restrict public access to the Facilities, nor charge a fee for public viewing of games, scrimmages or practices, except tournaments. The City reserves the right to use the Facilities when no games or practices are scheduled for the duration of this agreement. The City will provide reasonable notice for its use of the Facilities for special city events. The hours of operation of Texas Coast will be Monday through Friday from 4:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m., Saturdays, from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. and Sundays at any time when tournaments are scheduled between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

The City reserves the right to inspect the Facilities, including but not limited to fields and restrooms at any time.

Texas Coast will be responsible for the care and maintenance of the Facilities during the duration of this agreement. Facility maintenance shall consist of, but is not limited to:

- Preparation of fields for practice. (chalk line, goal adjustments, etc.)

D. Restrooms

The City agrees, at its expense, to provide adequate restroom facilities for Texas Coast use for the duration of this agreement. The City shall furnish hand soap, toilet paper, paper towels and other items that the City deems necessary for the use of such restroom facilities.

E. Concessions

The City agrees to provide concession keys to Texas Coast for access of the concession facilities, and Texas Coast agrees to lock the concession facilities at the close of each day's game. Concession keys must be returned within seven (7) days of the end of the agreement. Texas Coast must provide a key deposit of \$90.00 per key in the form of a check or money order. Texas Coast agrees that it shall not engage in any activities that generate profit beyond the sale of incidental items, such as water, soft drinks, and snacks such as pre-packaged or minimally processed food items, including but not limited to chips, crackers, granola bars, and candy. All revenues generated by Texas Coast must be used solely to cover operational expenses, maintenance, and improvements related to the Texas Coast's activities. Any profits derived from sources other than the incidental sales as listed above are strictly prohibited. Texas Coast shall provide the city a financial statement to ensure compliance with this provision.

F. Cleaning of Facilities

Texas Coast agrees to clean and clear the Facilities, including but not limited to, fields and bleachers, of any trash and equipment following each practice and each game or tournament. Any and all trash collected at the Facilities by Texas Coast shall be placed in trash cans provided by the City.

G. Additional Provisions

Texas Coast shall provide the following items to the City as a prerequisite for use of the Facilities:

1. Texas Coast agrees to carry liability insurance in the amounts of \$1,000,000.00 (one million) per person and \$1,000,000.00 (one million) per occurrence naming the City of Ingleside as additional insured, insuring Texas Coast against liabilities and claims occurring during the term of this agreement and related to the use, occupancy, possession, maintenance or repair of the Facilities by Texas Coast. Further, Texas Coast agrees to, and shall, provide the City with proof of such insurance coverage before the agreement is in effect and use of the Facility is permitted.
2. A listing of all coaches and assistant coaches, including any support staff, who have successfully passed a background check by an approved agency that conducts background checks that are current within the current calendar year. The City requires any coach, assistant coach, and any support staff who will be utilizing the Facilities as permitted by this agreement to have successfully completed a background check. Failure to comply with this requirement constitutes a breach of this agreement. Such list shall be provided to the City before the use of the Facilities by Texas Coast can be permitted.
3. A season schedule of games shall be provided to the City by Texas Coast prior to the start of the season and written notice shall be provided to the Director of Infrastructure Services of any rescheduling of games by at least one entire business day prior to when the rescheduled game(s)

is/are scheduled to be played. Such notice may be sent by email. A schedule of league games must be received ten (10) days prior to any league games being held. Practices may take place at the Facility prior to the receipt of the schedule; however, no official games may be played until the schedule has been received.

4. Texas Coast shall not assign this agreement, nor shall it sublease or rent out the Facilities of the City. All inquiries for subleasing or renting of the Facilities must be referred to the City for approval or disapproval at the City's sole discretion.
5. Texas Coast shall maintain its charter with the Texas Youth Soccer Association and shall maintain its financial viability and must keep and maintain accurate, current financial records in accordance with sound accounting and financial management practices and must, on request of the City, make available to the City of inspection and copying all such records.
6. Any and all personal property remaining at the Facilities at the time of expiration of this agreement will become the property of the City.
7. Texas Coast shall comply with any existing state or federal law, or city ordinance, and shall not use the Facilities in such manner as to constitute a nuisance.

H. Severability

If, for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase word or provision of this agreement shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgement of a Court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this contract, for it is the definite intent of the parties hereto that every section, paragraph , subdivision, clause, phrase, word and provision hereto be given full force and effect for its purpose.

I. Indemnification

TEXAS COAST AGREES AND UNDERSTANDS THAT IT IS SPONSORING AN ATHLETIC ACTIVITY THAT HAS CERTAIN INHERENT DANGERS, AND THAT PERSONS PARTICIPATING IN TEXAS COAST ACTIVITIES DISCUSSED HEREIN MAY BE INJURED ON THE PREMISES. TEXAS COAST UNDERSTANDS THAT THE CITY WILL ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE SAFE PREMISES, BUT THAT CONDITIONS MAY CHANGE OR DEVELOP, WHICH CREATE UNANTICIPATED DANGERS. TEXAS COAST AGREES AND REPRESENTS THAT IT SHALL INSPECT THE PREMISES AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH GAME AND PRACTICE SESSION, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE PLAYING FIELDS LOCATED AT THE FACILITIES, AND THAT TEXAS COAST HAS DETERMINED THAT SUCH PREMISES ARE REASONABLY SAFE FOR THE ACTIVITIES CONTEMPLATED BY TEXAS COAST HEREUNDER. TEXAS COAST FURTHER AGREES THAT AT ANY TIME ITS REPRESENTATIVES OBSERVE AN UNSAFE CONDITION ON THE PREMISES USED BY TEXAS COAST, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE PLAYING FIELDS LOCATED AT THE FACILITIES, TEXAS COAST SHALL IMMEDIATELY REPORT SUCH DANGEROUS CONDITION TO THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE. IF

THE DANGEROUS CONDITION POSES AN IMMINENT DANGER TEXAS COAST SHALL IMMEDIATELY DISCONTINUE THE ACTIVITY AND USE OF THAT PORTION OF THE FACILITIES.

TEXAS COAST AGREES TO DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY OF INGLESIDE, ITS AGENTS, OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS FOR BODILY INJURY, ILLNESS, DEATH, ECONOMIC LOSS, PERSONAL INJURY, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE ARISING OUT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF TEXAS COAST CONTEMPLATED HEREUNDER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY CLAIM ARISING OUT OF OR ALLEGED TO ARISE OUT OF ANY NEGLIGENT ACT OR OMISSION COMMITTED BY TEXAS COAST OFFICIALS, PLAYERS, MEMBERS, OFFICERS, OR AGENTS. NOTHING CONTAINED HEREIN SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT OR WAIVE ANY GOVERNMENTAL OR SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY OF THE CITY OF INGLESIDE OR ANY IMMUNITY APPLICABLE TO ITS OFFICIALS, AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES, NOR SHALL IT BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT OR WAIVE ANY INSURANCE COVERAGE OR THE CITY'S STATUS AS AN ADDITIONAL NAMED INSURED AS PROVIDED ABOVE OF THIS CONTRACT. TO THE EXTENT THERE MAY BE A WAIVER OF IMMUNITY UNDER STATE LAW TO ENFORCE THIS AGREEMENT, THE REMEDIES AVAILABLE TO ASSOCIATION TO ENFORCE THIS AGREEMENT ARE LIMITED TO MANDAMUS OR SPECIFIC PERFORMANCE. ALL OTHER REMEDIES, INCLUDING SUITS FOR DAMAGES AND RECOVERY OF ATTORNEYS' FEES ARE SPECIFICALLY WAIVED BY BOTH PARTIES.

J. Applicable Law

This agreement is entered into subject to the City Charter and ordinances of the City of Ingleside as they may be amended from time to time, and is subject to and is to be construed, governed and enforced under all applicable State of Texas and Federal laws.

K. Governmental Immunity

Texas Coast understands and agrees that the City of Ingleside is a Texas home-rule municipality and that by entering into this agreement, the City is performing a governmental function. No term or condition of the agreement shall be construed or interpreted as a waiver, express or implied, of any of the governmental or sovereign immunities, rights, benefits, or protections of City.

L. Termination of Agreement

Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement the City and/or Texas Coast may terminate the agreement on a no-fault basis at any time by giving the other party 30 days written notice.

M. Entire Agreement

This agreement embodies the complete agreement of the parties hereto, superseding all oral or written previous and contemporaneous agreements between the parties relating to matters herein, and except as otherwise provided herein, cannot be modified without written agreement of the parties.

Any failure of Texas Coast to adhere to this agreement after any violation has been reported by the City to Texas Coast may result in this facility usage agreement being terminated immediately.

Discussion, consideration, and possible action on the first reading of an Ordinance of the City of Ingleside, Texas, creating and adding Article VII, "Motor-Assisted Scooters, Bicycles, and Electric Bicycles," to Chapter 62, "Traffic and Vehicles," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingleside; adopting regulations governing the operation of motor-assisted scooters, bicycles, and electric bicycles upon public property; providing a penalty; providing a savings clause; providing a severability clause; providing for publication; and providing an effective date.

BACKGROUND:

With the increased use of electric bikes & scooters within Ingleside, a concern for the safety of the users and non-users has arisen. The City Council requested a report on current regulations and steps being taken to ensure the safety of users through education and regulations, that was provided during the April 14, 2026, City Council meeting.

The report provided the following information:

Texas E-Scooters are mostly stand-up e-scooters. They are “motor-assisted scooters,” not motor vehicles—defined by 2+ wheels, brakes, ≤40cc(or electric equivalent), a deck, and human-power capability. No Texas driver’s license, registration, plates, or state-issued insurance are required; riders generally follow bicycle-style traffic rules (signals, yielding, lights at night). The E-Scooters can be ridden on streets ≤35 mph (cross higher speeds at intersections), bike lanes and bike paths. Sidewalk riding is permitted statewide, but cities may restrict it and there is no statewide adult helmet/age rule.

E-Bikes are classified as having operable pedals + motor ≤ 750W. There are 3-class systems that clarify speed, operation, and expectations as follows: Class 1: pedal-assist to 20 mph; Class 2: throttle allowed, to 20 mph; Class 3: pedal-assist to 28 mph and requires a speedometer and rider age 15+. E-Bikes do not require a state license, registration, title, or insurance, and are generally allowed where bicycles are, but cities/parks may restrict sidewalks, trails, or Class 3 access. In addition, there is no statewide adult helmet mandate. However, they must follow bicycle traffic laws: yield to pedestrians, use lights at night, and ride with traffic. E-Bikes are generally treated as bicycles and are allowed on roadways, bike lanes, and shared-use paths unless locally restricted. Sidewalk access is primarily a local decision; Class 3 e-bikes are more often restricted on sidewalks and narrow shared paths due to higher speeds.

E-Scooters are allowed on public streets posted at 35 mph or less; may cross higher-speed roads at intersections but not travel along them. They are allowed in bike lanes and on bicycle-only paths. Sidewalk use is permitted by state law, but cities may prohibit it in high-pedestrian areas.

Texas sets baseline access while allowing cities to add restrictions. Ordinances and clear signage can define no-ride zones, speed-limited areas, and time-of-day rules that can reduce conflicts and support consistent enforcement.

To address the local concerns, the proposed Ordinance will include more explicit rules to be considered by Council.

The proposed Ordinance is has been through legal for review.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Ingleside, Texas, amending Chapter 62 - Traffic and Vehicles, Article V - Golf Carts, Neighborhood Electric Vehicles, and Off-Highway Vehicles; by restricting the use of Motorized Scooters and bikes, also known as 'E-Scooters' and 'Electric Bikes,' on any public property; and further, making findings of fact; defining purpose and authority for said amendment; providing a savings clause; providing a severability clause; providing a penalty clause; providing for publication by caption; and providing an effective date be passed to second reading.

Sec. 551.106. Regulation of Bicycles by Department or Local Authority.

- (a) The department or a local authority may not prohibit the operation of an electric bicycle:
 - (1) on a highway that is used primarily by motor vehicles; or
 - (2) in an area in which the operation of a nonelectric bicycle is permitted, unless the area is a path that:
 - (A) is not open to motor vehicles; and
 - (B) has a natural surface tread made by clearing and grading the native soil without adding surfacing materials.
- (b) The department or a local authority may:
 - (1) prohibit the operation of a bicycle on a sidewalk; and
 - (2) establish speed limits for bicycles on paths set aside for the exclusive operation of bicycles and other paths on which bicycles may be operated.
- (c) The department may establish rules for the administration of this section if necessary.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF INGLESIDE, TEXAS, CREATING AND ADDING ARTICLE VII, "MOTOR-ASSISTED SCOOTERS, BICYCLES, AND ELECTRIC BICYCLES," TO CHAPTER 62, "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF INGLESIDE; ADOPTING REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE OPERATION OF MOTOR-ASSISTED SCOOTERS, BICYCLES, AND ELECTRIC BICYCLES UPON PUBLIC PROPERTY; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Ingleside is a home-rule municipality operating pursuant to Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution and is authorized under Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001 and other applicable law to adopt ordinances to protect the public health, safety, and welfare;

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code recognizes the authority of municipalities to regulate the operation of bicycles, electric bicycles, and motor-assisted scooters in certain circumstances, and the City Council for the City of Ingleside ("City Council") desires to exercise that authority in a manner consistent with applicable state law;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the increasing use of motor-assisted scooters, bicycles, and electric bicycles, particularly by children, has resulted in more frequent operation upon public streets, sidewalks, trails, parks, and other public property, creating safety concerns for operators, pedestrians, motorists, and other users of public property;

WHEREAS, the City Council further finds that children are increasingly operating such devices upon public streets without adequate supervision, increasing the risk of collisions, injuries, and conflicts with vehicular traffic;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that encouraging parents and legal guardians to supervise the operation of motor-assisted scooters, bicycles, and electric bicycles by children and to ensure compliance with this Ordinance will reduce unsafe operation, improve public safety, and protect children and other users of public property;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that reasonable regulations governing the operation of motor-assisted scooters, bicycles, and electric bicycles will promote the safe and orderly use of such devices, protect public property, reduce conflicts among users of public property, and establish clear and uniform standards for lawful operation within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that adoption of the regulations attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is necessary and appropriate to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the City and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLESIDE, COUNTY OF SAN PATRICIO, STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein for all purposes as findings of the City Council.

SECTION 2. Adoption. The City of Ingleside Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, "Traffic and Vehicles," is hereby amended by adding Article VII, "Motor-Assisted Scooters, Bicycles, and Electric Bicycles," in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION 3. Codification. It is the intent of the City Council that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingleside. The City Secretary or the City's codifier may renumber or reletter the provisions of this Ordinance and make such nonsubstantive revisions as are necessary to accomplish codification.

SECTION 4. Savings. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict only. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and the City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each provision thereof irrespective of the invalidity of any particular provision.

SECTION 6. Penalty. Any person violating any provision of Article VII adopted by this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties provided therein and as otherwise provided by the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingleside.

SECTION 7. Publication. The City Secretary shall cause this Ordinance to be published as required by the City Charter and applicable law.

SECTION 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective on _____, 2026, following its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

EXHIBIT “A”

Article VII Motor Assisted Scooters, Bicycles, and Electric Bicycles

Sec. 62-230. Purpose.

The purpose of this article is to promote the safe and orderly operation of motor-assisted scooters, bicycles, and electric bicycles upon public property, to protect the public health, safety, and welfare, to protect pedestrians and other users of public facilities, and to preserve public property.

62-231 Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Bicycle means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 541.201, as amended, a device that a person may ride and that is propelled by human power and has two tandem wheels at least one of which is more than fourteen (14) inches in diameter.

Child means any person less than 18 years of age.

Electric bicycle means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 664.001, as amended, a bicycle equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of fewer than 750 watts with a top assisted speed of twenty-eight (28) miles per hour or less. The three classes of electric bicycles are as follows:

Class 1 electric bicycle means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 664.001, as amended, an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that assists the rider only while pedaling and that has a top assisted speed of twenty (20) miles per hour or less.

Class 2 electric bicycle means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 664.001, as amended, an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that may propel the bicycle without the rider pedaling and that has a top assisted speed of twenty (20) miles per hour or less.

Class 3 electric bicycle means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 664.001, as amended, an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that assists the rider only while the rider is pedaling and that has a top assisted speed of more than twenty (20) miles per hour but less than twenty-eight (28) miles per hour.

Helmet means properly fitted headgear that is not structurally damaged, and that conforms to the standards of the American National Standards Institute, the American Society for Testing and Materials, the Snell Memorial Foundation, or any federal agency having regulatory jurisdiction over bicycle helmets, as applicable, at the time of the manufacture of the helmet.

Motor-assisted scooter means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 551.351, as amended, a self-propelled device with at least two wheels in contact with the ground during operation, a braking system capable of stopping the device under typical operating conditions, a gas or electric motor not exceeding forty (40) cubic centimeters, a deck designed to allow a person to stand or sit while operating the device, and the ability to be propelled by human power alone. The term does not include a pocket bike or minimotorbike.

Operate means to ride, use, propel, or otherwise be in physical control of a motor-assisted scooter, bicycle, electric bicycle, or pocket bike in motion.

Parent means the natural or adoptive parent or court-appointed guardian or conservator of a child.

Pocket bike or minimotorbike means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 551.351, as amended, a self-propelled vehicle equipped with an electric motor or an internal combustion engine having a piston displacement of less than fifty (50) cubic centimeters, designed to propel itself with not more than two wheels in contact with the ground, equipped with a seat or saddle for the operator, not designed for use on a highway, and ineligible for a certificate of title under Chapter 501 of the Texas Transportation Code.

Public street means a city owned or dedicated road, street, drive, alley or other right-of-way for the use of vehicles within the City of Ingleside's corporate boundaries.

Public property means any public street, sidewalk, trail, boardwalk, park, playground, splash pad, recreational area, parking area, public facility, or other real property owned, leased, maintained, controlled, or operated by the City that is open to or intended for use by the public.

Unimproved surface means any portion of public property that is not paved or otherwise improved and designated for pedestrian or vehicular travel, including grass, landscaped areas, natural ground, and similar surfaces.

Top assisted speed means, as that term is defined in Texas Transportation Code Section 664.001, as amended, the speed at which an electric bicycle's motor ceases propelling the bicycle or assisting the rider.

Trail means a designated pathway, whether paved or unpaved, intended primarily for pedestrian or recreational use.

Sidewalk means the portion of a public street that is between a curb or lateral line of a public street and the adjacent property line and intended for pedestrian use.

62-232 Operation of Motor-Assisted Scooters, Bicycles, and Electric Bicycles.

(a) Motor-assisted Scooters

- (1) Motor-assisted scooters may be operated, subject to this article and applicable state law, upon sidewalks, trails, public streets with a posted speed limit of thirty-five (35) miles per hour or less, and upon other public property designated and posted by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee for such use.

(b) Bicycle and Electric Bicycles

- (1) Bicycles and electric bicycles may be operated, subject to this article and applicable state law, upon public streets, sidewalks, trails, and upon other public property designated and posted by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee for such use.

62-233 Prohibited Operation.

- (a) A person may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter upon a public street with a posted speed limit greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour. A Motor-Assisted Scooter may

cross a public street with a posted speed limit greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour at an intersection.

- (b) A person may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle within playground areas, splash pad areas, athletic fields, or other area designated and posted by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee as restricted.
- (c) A person may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon an unimproved surface of public property, except for the purpose of accessing a public street, sidewalk, or trail for a distance not exceeding twenty (20) feet and in a manner that does not damage the surface.
- (d) A person may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle in a careless, reckless, or unsafe manner that interferes with pedestrian traffic or endangers any person or property.
- (e) Minimum Age for operation on public streets:
 - (1) A person under thirteen (13) years of age may operate a bicycle, Class 1 electric bicycle, Class 2 electric bicycle, or motor-assisted scooter upon a public street only when accompanied by and under the direct supervision of a parent or legal guardian.
 - (2) A person under fifteen (15) years of age may not operate a Class 3 Electric Bicycle. This subsection does not prohibit a person under fifteen (15) years of age from riding as a passenger on a Class 3 Electric Bicycle and shall be construed consistent with Texas Transportation Code Section 551.107(c), as amended.
- (f) A person may not operate or ride a Minimotorbike or Pocket Bike on any public street, sidewalk, trail, or other public property.

Sec. 62-234 Equipment and Operating Requirements.

- (a) A child may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon public property unless the child wears a properly fitted and securely fastened helmet.
- (b) A child may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon public property while wearing headphones, earbuds, or other listening devices in both ears that impair the child's ability to hear surrounding traffic, pedestrians, or other hazards.
- (c) No person operating a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle shall carry a passenger unless the motor-assisted scooter, bicycle, or electric bicycle is specifically designed and equipped by the manufacturer for the transportation of a passenger.
- (d) A person may not operate a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon public property unless it is equipped with a bell, horn, or other audible warning device in good working order. The operator shall use the audible warning device when reasonably necessary to warn pedestrians or other persons of the operator's approach.
- (e) A person operating a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon a public street shall obey all official traffic-control devices, traffic-control signals, and applicable state and local traffic laws.
- (f) A Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle may not be operated between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise unless equipped with:
 - (1) A white light visible from at least five hundred (500) feet to the front; and
 - (2) A red reflector visible from at least three hundred (300) feet to the rear, or a red lamp visible from at least five hundred (500) feet to the rear.

62-235 Operation on Sidewalks and Trails

- (a) A person operating a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon sidewalks or trails shall not exceed ten (10) miles per hour.
- (b) A person operating a Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon sidewalks or trails at N.O. Simmons Park shall not exceed five (5) miles per hour.

62-236 Pedestrian Safety.

- (a) A person operating a Motor-Assisted scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle shall:
 - a. yield the right-of-way to pedestrians;
 - b. slow to a safe speed and provide an audible warning to pedestrians before passing them; and
 - c. not obstruct crosswalks.

Sec. 62-237 Parental Responsibility.

A parent, guardian, or person having legal custody of a child may not knowingly permit the child to violate the provisions of this article. A violation of this section constitutes a separate offense.

Sec. 62-238 Public Events.

The City Manager or the City Manager's designee may temporarily prohibit or restrict the operation of Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle upon designated public property during a permitted event, city-sponsored event, emergency, construction activity, or other circumstance when necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare.

Sec. 62-239. Penalty.

- (a) A person who violates any provision of this article commits an offense punishable as a Class C misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine as provided in Section 1-14 of this Code.
- (b) Each violation of this article and each day a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Sec. 62-240. Affirmative defense.

It is an affirmative defense to prosecution for a violation of a provision of this article that the Motor-Assisted Scooter, Bicycle, or Electric Bicycle, Minimotorbike or Pocket Bike was not being operated upon public property at the time of the alleged offense.

BACKGROUND:

On February 13, 2024, the Ingleside City Council approved a resolution authorizing the City of Ingleside, Texas, to submit an application to the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Division for a grant for the License Plate Reader project for fiscal year 2025. The resolution, numbered 2024-14, was passed and approved on the same date. The requested grant amount was \$24,999.96 for the installation of six Flock cameras at various locations throughout the City of Ingleside. The camera locations are as follows:

1. 2800 Main Street - Southbound
2. Avenue A @ Beasley - Southbound
3. Highway 361 @ 12th Street - Southbound
4. Highway 361 @ Chemours - Eastbound
5. Highway 361 @ City Limits - Westbound
6. Main Street @ Highland - Southbound

The installation of the cameras was delayed due to permitting issues with the Texas Department of Transportation and the Texas Department of Public Safety. The cameras became operational on November 17, 2025.

Additionally, the Ingleside Police Department paid an invoice for \$12,000 for a 12-month subscription covering the period from October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2026.

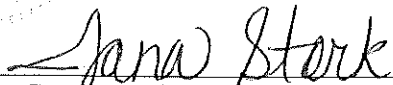

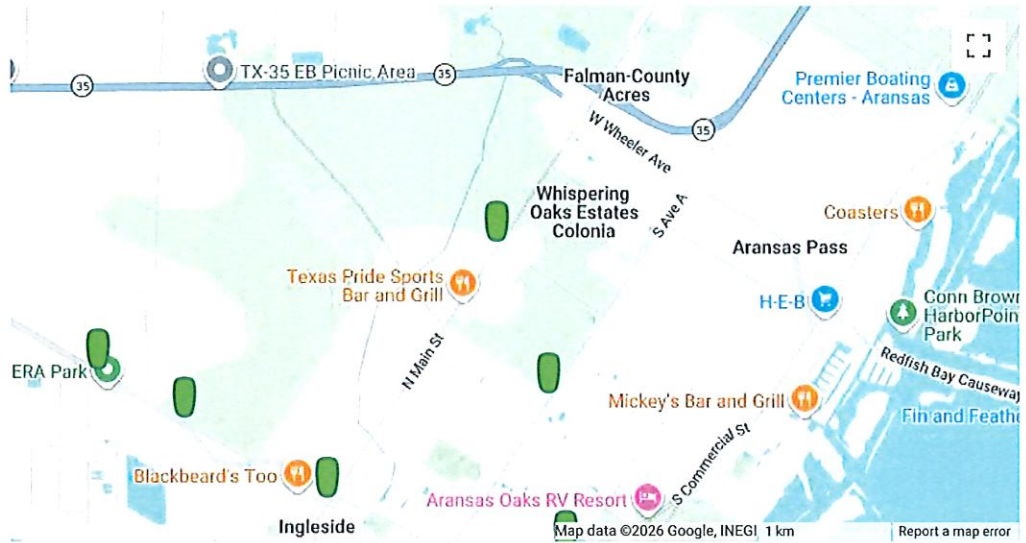

Due to the importance of timely reporting, applicants are required to submit complete and accurate UCR data, as well as the Texas-mandated reporting, on a no less than monthly basis and respond promptly to requests from DPS related to the data submitted.

Entities That Collect Sexual Assault/Sex Offense Evidence or Investigate/Prosecute Sexual Assault or Other Sex Offenses

In accordance with Texas Government Code, Section 420.034, any facility or entity that collects evidence for sexual assault or other sex offenses or investigates or prosecutes a sexual assault or other sex offense for which evidence has been collected, must participate in the statewide electronic tracking system developed and implemented by the Texas Department of Public Safety. Visit [DPS's Sexual Assault Evidence Tracking Program website](#) for more information or to set up an account to begin participating. Additionally, per Section 420.042 "A law enforcement agency that receives evidence of a sexual assault or other sex offense...shall submit that evidence to a public accredited crime laboratory for analysis no later than the 30th day after the date on which that evidence was received." A law enforcement agency in possession of a significant number of Sexual Assault Evidence Kits (SAEK) where the 30-day window has passed may be considered noncompliant.

DNA Testing of Evidentiary Materials

When funds are used for DNA testing of evidentiary materials, any resulting eligible DNA profiles must be uploaded to the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) by a government DNA lab with access to CODIS.

Interoperable Communications

Funds to support emergency communications activities must ensure compliance with the FY 2018 SAFECOM Guidance on Emergency Communications Grants; adherence to the technical standards set forth in the FCC Waiver Order, or any succeeding FCC orders, rules, or regulations pertaining to broadband operations in the 700 MHz public safety band; and are fully coordinated with the full-time [Statewide Interoperability Coordinator \(SWIC\)](#) for Texas.

Twelve-Step Programs

Grant funds may not be used to support or directly fund programs such as the Twelve Step Program which courts have ruled are inherently religious. PSO grant funds cannot be used to support these programs, conduct meetings, or purchase related materials.

Program Income

Applicant agrees to comply with all federal and state rules and regulations for program income and agrees to report all program income that is generated as a result of the project's activities. Applicant agrees to report program income through a formal grant adjustment and to secure PSO approval prior to use of the program income. Applicant agrees to use program income for allowable costs and agrees to expend program income immediately after PSO's approval of a grant adjustment and prior to requesting reimbursement of funds.

Deduction Method - Program income shall be deducted from total allowable costs to determine the net allowable costs. Program income shall be used for current costs unless PSO authorizes otherwise. Program income which the grantee did not anticipate at the time of the award shall be used to reduce the PSO award and grantee match rather than to increase the funds committed to the project.

Asset Seizures and Forfeitures - Program income from asset seizures and forfeitures is considered earned when the property has been adjudicated to the benefit of the plaintiff (e.g., law enforcement entity).

National Instant Background Check System (NICS)

Project Abstract :

The City of Ingleside has submitted a proposal requesting funds to equip the Ingleside Police Department with Mobile License Plate Reader (LPR) cameras. These mobile LPR cameras will enhance public safety and security by identifying vehicles involved in crimes and improving traffic management on FM 1069, Hwy 361, and other major streets in Ingleside, Texas. The prominent industry in and around Ingleside brings in over 14,000 vehicles through the city streets daily. LPR cameras provide valuable evidence and leads for criminal investigations by tracking the movements and locations of vehicles. These cameras will provide more evidence on suspect vehicles, solving more crime. Investigators can sift through camera footage with minimal identifiers, saving hundreds of man-hours.

Problem Statement :

The City of Ingleside is in need of acquiring License Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras for the Ingleside Police Department. The City is experiencing severe traffic issues due to its large industrial area, leading to security problems and crimes. LPR cameras are valuable technology that can automatically capture and identify the license plates of vehicles passing by. The cameras have various applications in law enforcement, traffic management, and security. They can be remotely monitored by Ingleside Police officers and dispatchers from their monitors, making them a useful tool in managing traffic. This technology can help control vehicle congestion, identify stolen and wanted vehicles, find missing individuals, and prevent crimes.

Supporting Data :

Ingleside Police Department records indicate the City of Ingleside is dealing with the issue of hit-and-run drivers fleeing the area via Main Street, the primary route to a large industrial employer that hires up to 8200 people. According to the Texas Department of Transportation Traffic Count Database System, approximately 14,576 vehicles daily pass through FM 1069, the city's main thoroughfare. Additionally, Hwy 361, a main road leading to Ingleside's main street, receives a significant number of vehicles daily from the city's east side. It's necessary to take action to solve this problem. The LPR system will enable us to identify and locate the drivers responsible for hit-and-run accidents, bring them to justice, and ensure the safety of all drivers on the road.

Project Approach & Activities:

The City of Ingleside will install five fixed data point (LPR) license plate reader cameras on major roads and highways that lead to and from the city. These LPR cameras will be positioned in high-traffic volume areas to capture the license plates of vehicles traveling in both directions. This will provide criminal investigators and patrol officers with valuable information about the direction of travel of suspect vehicles. Moreover, LPR trailers will also be positioned in high-crime areas to capture suspects traveling to or leaving the location.

Capacity & Capabilities:

The Ingleside Police Department is staffed with 28 sworn police officers, which includes the command staff. These officers are responsible for responding to various service calls ranging from theft to capital murder. They are all trained to conduct preliminary investigations into incidents and report suspect information and vehicle details to the dispatchers. The department has eight full-time dispatchers who enter license plate information or suspect vehicle descriptions into the LPR database, which can result in a "hit". This information is relayed in real-time to neighboring cities such as Aransas Pass PD, Portland PD, Gregory PD, and the San Patricio Sheriff to be on the lookout for the suspect vehicle. Criminal Investigators can also use this database as a research tool to identify suspects and capture crimes in progress. The Department is available for LPR System training as needed.

Performance Management :

The Ingleside Police Department command officers will provide leadership and guidance toward meeting all program goals. The Department will install a License Plate Recognition (LPR) system to capture the license plates and vehicle descriptions of the cars leaving the area. This system will help us identify and track down the drivers responsible for hit-and-run accidents. We will have a close working relationship with the LPR project team to have the best-trained officers and operators of the LPR system. The Ingleside Police Department will develop an LPR policy to set standard operating procedures for officers and dispatchers. The police department would appoint an internal project manager to coordinate logistics and training and liaise with the provider's project manager. The police department would conduct quarterly evaluations and use electronic spreadsheets to capture the use of the equipment and continue to evaluate the communication capabilities. Statistical data will be compared to past reports to measure performance throughout the grant period.

Target Group :

All sworn staff and police dispatchers of the Ingleside Police Department would provide any relevant information to law enforcement agencies in case of possible sightings of suspect vehicles within our city. We may also share visual documentation with the Texas Department of Transportation to help manage traffic issues.

Evidence-Based Practices:

Our city has been experimenting with LPR technology on a trial basis and it has yielded great results. Not only were we able to identify suspicious vehicles using our own LPR system, but we also received assistance from the neighboring town of Aransas Pass. In fact, thanks to their LPR footage, we were able to identify a suspect involved in three shootings that occurred over the course of five hours. Our officers were able to use the LPR image provided by the Aransas Pass PD to apprehend the suspect.

BACKGROUND:

The need for various street maintenance equipment, including a street sweeper, crack sealer, steel drum roller, and pneumatic roller to maintain existing streets within Ingleside has come to the forefront in City Council discussions during the budget process. The equipment is reasonably necessary to maintain and repair eligible streets or sidewalks. However, the revenue cannot be diverted to unrelated municipal purposes because the statute limits use of the funds to street and sidewalk maintenance and repair.

Examples that may be supportable if directly tied to street maintenance operations include:

- Pavers
- Road graders
- Asphalt patch trucks
- Street sweepers
- Crack sealing machine
- Steel drum rollers
- Pneumatic rollers

Other equipment used in the maintenance and repair of municipal streets that existed prior to May 6, 2023.

Texas Tax Code § 327.008 states that:

"Revenue from the tax imposed under this chapter may be used only to maintain and repair municipal streets or sidewalks existing on the date of the election to adopt the tax." The statute does not expressly list equipment purchases as an authorized expenditure. Therefore, the legal justification is that the purchase is a necessary component of the city's street maintenance and repair program, rather than a general fleet acquisition.

Documenting the use of the equipment is essential with the following being addressed:

The street maintenance purpose of the equipment.

How the equipment will be used to maintain or repair eligible streets/sidewalks.

The equipment's primary use is maintenance of eligible municipal streets.
The streets being maintained existed on the date of the election approving the tax.
The equipment will not be used substantially for unrelated functions without an appropriate cost allocation.
The expenditure is included within the city's street maintenance program and budget.

BACKGROUND:

The Street Department is continuing to acquire the equipment needed to perform street maintenance in-house. While some of the necessary equipment has already been purchased, several key pieces of equipment are still needed. This purchase will provide staff with one of those essential items. This equipment will enable staff to assist with the maintenance of our City streets by removing debris and buildup that accumulates along the curbs. When the street maintenance tax fund was voted on and approved by the citizens of Ingleside, it was stipulated that the funds would be used to maintain the streets that existed at the time of the vote. This equipment will be used to support that purpose. A quote was obtained for this equipment using a Purchasing Cooperative. The 2026 Bucher E35 Mechanical Street Sweeper will be purchased through Sourcewell Contract #062425-BUC. A quote was also obtained for a 2026 Bucher MaxPowa V50T, which is a street sweeper with a vacuum. After staff consulted with the Closner representative and TxDot personnel, the recommendation was to select a mechanical street sweeper rather than a vacuum sweeper, as the sandy environment would result in excessive wear on the vacuum equipment.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

This equipment will be purchased in the amount of \$376,554.00 through Fund 28, the Street Maintenance Tax Fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval for this purchase of a 2026 Bucher E35 Mechanical Street Sweeper for the Streets Department in the amount of \$376,554.00, Sourcewell Purchasing Cooperative, Contract #062425-BUC.

Upon failure of the Buyer to make any of the payments as stipulated herein, all unpaid installments shall immediately become due and payable, and the Seller may repossess itself of said property wherever the same may be found, and shall not be liable, in any action for such reclamation nor for the payment of any money or moneys that have been paid in part payment for said property, but the sum so paid shall be deemed to be compensation only for the use, wear and tear of said property.

3. Transport and insurance. The property herein described shall not move from its original destination without the written consent of the Seller, and the Buyer shall keep the interest of the Seller in said property insured against loss or damage, and agrees to provide and maintain in Seller's name, as its interests may appear, adequate insurance for such machinery against loss or damage by fire, in an amount fully protecting Seller until such machinery is fully paid for, and on written request by the Seller, deposit with it, the policies of insurance covering such property. The Buyer further agrees to reimburse the Seller for any loss which it may sustain by reason of fire, theft, or injury to such machinery or any part thereof.

4. Erection risk. The Buyer shall assume all risks connected with the work of erecting the property and shall be liable for all damage or injury to the property or to persons employed on, or in connection with, the work, except to the Seller's engineer, and shall protect the Seller against all claims arising from any such injury or damage. The Buyer shall assume all risks of the loss or destruction of the property, in any manner whatsoever; from the time it is placed on the car for shipment until it is fully paid for in cash. When a

representative is furnished to superintend erection of the equipment the Buyer shall, when erection is complete, sign the letter of acceptance presented by such representative.

5. Order acceptance. The Order shall not be binding upon the Seller until accepted by it and approved as to credit, shipment, etc., by an executive officer of the Seller, and when so approved and accepted, shall constitute a binding agreement upon the parties hereto, and all rights of the parties hereto shall be governed by the laws existing at the time the same is made, in the State in which the Seller is located.

6. Entire agreement. This order when accepted by the Seller as herein provided shall constitute the entire agreement: and the contract so expressed shall not be subject to any circumstances or agreement, verbal or otherwise, excepting only such as are made after the contract mutually accepted and approved in writing by an executive officer of the Seller.

BACKGROUND:

The Streets Department is continuing to acquire the equipment needed to perform street maintenance in-house. While some of the necessary equipment has already been purchased, several key pieces of equipment are still needed. This purchase will provide staff with one of those essential items. This equipment is designed to apply a thick stream of heated tar into pavement cracks, effectively sealing them against water intrusion. Water that penetrates through cracks into the roadway sub-base is a primary cause of pavement deterioration and street failure. By sealing these cracks, the Crack Sealer helps prevent water from reaching the sub-base, extending the life of the pavement and reducing the need for costly repairs. When the tax fund was voted on and approved by the citizens of Ingleside, it was stipulated this money would be used for the maintenance of the streets that were in place at the time of the vote. This equipment will be used for that purpose. A quote was obtained for this equipment using a Purchasing Cooperative. The M1 Heated Hose Crack Sealer Machine will be purchased through Sourcewell Contract #05062-CME.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

This equipment will be purchased in the amount of \$74,920.00 through Fund 28, the Street Maintenance Tax Fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval for this purchase of a M1 Heated Hose Crack Sealer Machine in the amount of \$74,920.00, through the Sourcewell Contract #05062-CME.

BACKGROUND:

As required by TCEQ, the elevated storage tanks in our distribution system must have maintenance done to them every five years. All three of our elevated storage tanks are due for this maintenance. A Request of Qualifications (RFQ) was submitted to solicit an engineering firm to design, bid, and administer this maintenance. The RFQ was published in the paper on July 9, and July 16, 2026, and also posted on Planet Bids. Four firms submitted Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) for consideration. Those firms are Dunham Engineering, Halff Associates, Inc., Lynn Engineering, LLC., and Tomkins Engineering Inc. An evaluation of these SOQ's was performed by City staff members, Director of Infrastructure Services, Gary Paredez, Director of Finance, Luis Rios, Assistant City Secretary, Elisabeth Staton, and Administrative Assistant, Erika Villarreal. A scoresheet is attached indicating the scores for each firm. Halff Associates, Inc. had the apparent high score.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

This project will be funded by Fund 57 for CO2024 Bond.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends City Council to authorize City Manager to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Halff Associates, Inc. for the design, bidding, and administering a maintenance contract for the elevated storage tanks.
